

# Ribbon Storage

Ribbonrie



## Supplies Needed:

- 6 acrylic boxes
- 6 wood knobs
- 1 black chipboard box
- 1 metal face plate
- 2 small eyelets
- 1 ribbon label (left side of photo)
- 18 extra large black eyelets
- Crop-a-dile
- Black paint

**Instructions:** Cut out “Ribbonrie” label from these instructions (found on the left side of photo) or print your own. Adhere it to the back of the book plate and attach to the front of the box using the “Big-Bite” crop-o-dile from We-R Memory Keepers. Measure and equally space ribbon holes on the front of each of the six clear acrylic boxes and mark with a pen. Use the crop-o-dile to punch the holes. NOTE: when punching the holes it may cause a slight hair-line fracture in the plastic. This is okay, the eyelet should cover it. Next, set the eyelets in the holes and thread desired ribbon through. Paint wooden knobs black and adhere to the top of each lid.

**Ribbon Box-** Cover a “raw goods” recipe box from We-R Memory keepers with your favorite patterned paper. Attach Extra Large eyelets on the front and thread the ribbon through the front.

**Ribbon Jars-** Use large canning jars. Paint the lids and rings with the color you desire. Punch holes through the lid using the Crop-o-dile, and then set extra large eyelets. Thread ribbon through the holes and screw on the lid.
